Monstrous Motherhood groups the eighteenth century's cultural representations of maternity into four categories: maternal dominance, infanticide, stepmotherhood, and maternal absence (18). The cultural stories that emerged from the different maternal epistemologies governing these categories, Francus claims, alleviated social anxieties about motherhood while establishing the script of modern maternity.
